

State and National Register of Historic Places Plaques

Plaques are available for purchase and display by owners of properties that are listed on the State or National Register of Historic Places.

There are different types of plaques for each of the following historic designations: property listed on the State Register (individually or as part of a district), property individually listed on the National Register, and property that contributes to a National Register historic district. The State Historic Preservation Office will choose which plaque you receive based on the historic designation that your property has. Each plaque is made of aluminum with pre-drilled holes for exterior mounting and measures approximately four by seven inches. The State Historic Preservation Office does not offer wayfinding signage for entering and exiting historic districts.

To order a plaque:

- ➤ Write a check written to Treasurer, State of Connecticut for \$50.00.
 - The plaques are subsidized by the State Historic Preservation Office. This fee covers a portion of the cost of manufacturing.
- ➤ Include the following information with your check:
 - Your name
 - Address of the property you are requesting the plaque for
 - Mailing address to send the plaque to
 - Email (optional if you would like notification when the plaque has been shipped)


