### **Park and Recreation Commission**

Minutes of the Meeting November 8th, 2017

**Meeting called to order:** 7:35 pm.

**Approval of Minutes:** Motion made and seconded to approve the October minutes. Passed unanimously.

**Public Input:** George Caye spoke to the group about SWLL wanting a sign placed at the Shack facing the road. Cost estimates were around \$4000. He asked if the town could make a sign in house for the cost of materials. John will speak to the parks crew and get an estimate of material costs and hopefully get a sign made over the winter. SWLL would need a permit to get a sign placed on the shack. They will also install pitching rubbers and home plates near the batting cages if SWLL purchases the materials.

**Master Plan Mapping**: The group looked at two more parks in town. George made an excel spread sheet of the town parks to use as a reference when rating parks. Craig asked if there is a way to determine if all parks are being utilized to their full potential and what the purchase cost of each was for better determining the value against use.

1) Fairgrounds at Rye (83 acres)

Strengths

- Prox. to Rye St Park (Parking, Rest Rooms)
- Large flat area for future rentals and sports use
- State Debris sight
- Summer and winter use

### Weaknesses

- Need a sign
- No Amenities (Elect., H2O, Storage, Parking ETC)
- Restrooms
- Railway prevents connecting with Rye St. Park

### **Enhancements**

- Permanent Parking
- Restrooms
- Water, Electrical, Lights
- Picnic Table
- Storage Facility
- Security Cameras

An aside to the use of the area for events, Ray and John are going to a state meeting about managing large town events (Strawberry Fest, Apple Harvest, Light the Night) and how to get a better understanding to get everything set up for issues (site design, parking design, overflow issues). They want to have a permanent plan in place to set up for all town events, including large sporting events at Rye Street and Nevers Park. Another issue that will be coming up is

food vendors and the need for health inspections at events. A policy needs to be set to tie all the town departments in to any event (SWPD, SWFD, Health, Parks, Rec, Board of Ed. Etc.

2) Lawrence Road Park (57 Acres)

# Strengths:

- Flat land
- Prox. to many houses with connecting sidewalks
- Trails
- Picnic area
- Pond
- Parking area

#### Weaknesses:

- Not an active Park
- To remote and wet on the north end beyond the pond
- Not enough cleared space

#### **Enhancements:**

- Clear more of the invasive plants and trees
- Prepare a field for rec use
- Gazebo by the pond

This park has its own master plan and is one of the parks that is underutilized and there is a large amount of town residents that would be able to use the park if it was built up according to the master plan. This is one of the only parks in that area for residents.
