- Bounce House discussion—previous vendor provided workers and had areas set up for lines; further discussion next year (cost savings may not be worth it if vendor workers and lines desired)

- After action suggestions:
 - Large dumpster to be placed behind vendors
 - Vendors instructed to place their trash in dumpster
 - Jaycees should be responsible for cleanup (we certainly can help, but responsibility should not be totally ours)
 - Ensure that the National Anthem is played at the beginning or end of the evening, prior to fireworks
 - Six signs for portolet directions; leave portolets where they were this year
