subject: NOTICE OF CONSTRUCTION
Reconstruction of the Route 194
Railroad/Highway At-Grade Crossing
South Windsor, Connecticut

date: September 30, 2020

TYPE OF PROJECT: The upgrading of the Route 194 (Sullivan Avenue) railroad/highway at-grade crossing on the East Windsor Secondary of the Connecticut Southern Railroad Company. The work includes the replacement of the existing crossing surface and will be performed as part of a joint effort between the Connecticut Department of Transportation and the Connecticut Southern Railroad Company.

WHERE: Town of South Windsor, Route 194 (Sullivan Avenue)

WHEN: Complete road closure of Route 194 at the railroad/highway at-grade crossing will begin at 7:00 p.m. Friday, October 16, 2020 and is expected to remain closed until 5:00 a.m. Monday, October 19, 2020, unless the work is completed sooner.

TERMINI: Work will be confined to the area of the railroad/highway at-grade crossing.

SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES: Weather permitting, it is expected that there will be a complete closure at the railroad/highway at-grade crossing for a period no longer than four (4) consecutive days. A detour will be implemented via fixed message signs installed by the Connecticut Department of Transportation. Route 194 eastbound motorists will be detoured onto Rye Street, then directed onto Troy Road to get back onto Route 194. Route 194 westbound motorists will be detoured onto Troy Road, then directed to Rye Street to get back onto Route 194. All associated emergency personnel for the Town of South Windsor have been notified concerning the crossing closure and the detour. Access to businesses will remain open while the detour is in place.

There will be an increase in noise levels near the railroad crossing due to the construction. There also will be construction activities occurring at night starting Friday (October 16th) until Monday morning (October 19th).
