Residential Recyclables are collected at the curb every other week, on the residents' normal refuse collection day. Collection for Condominiums is weekly on Wednesday.

ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS







Mixed Paper—Magazines, Junk Mail, Computer Paper and mixed office paper



Phone Books Newspapers



Cardboard (Flatten) inside the recycling cart

Aluminum (Cans)



No. 1—No. 7 Plastic food and laundry Product containers (rinsed but not crushed)



Paperboard (Example: cereal boxes, shoe boxes, pasta boxes)



Glass Bottles & Jars (rinsed and unbroken; leave labels on)



Metal Cans/Containers

NO PLASTIC BAGS, PLEASE DO NOT BAG YOUR RECYCLABLES







Unacceptable Paper—Soiled paper, soiled napkins & paper towels, pet food bags & dryer sheets.

Unacceptable Plastics—Any plastic that doesn't have a number on it. (Examples—garden hose, trash and ziplock bags, cereal box bags, bubble wrap, clear plastic wrap, potato chip bags, single cheese wrappers, soiled plastic bottles and bags.

Unacceptable All Styrofoam—While it may seem recyclable, there is not enough material left after breaking it down to make a new product.

Unacceptable Aluminum—Soiled aluminum foil, soiled tin cans, no frying pans.
Unacceptable Cardboard—Soiled pizza boxes and soiled cardboard. (Examples—grease, mold, paint).

ANTIFREEZE	Antifreeze drained from engine cooling systems.	Pour into clean, clear plastic capped (screw cap or taped cap) container.	Do not mix with other liquids.
USED OIL FILTERS	Used vehicle oil filters	Drain residual oil from filter, place in plastic container.	Oil filters not drained.
LEAVES	 Curbside collection in the Fall Spring drop off at the Leaf Compost Site on Burgess Road. Call (860) 648-6366 to obtain a key for compost area. NOTICE TO SOUTH WINDSOR RESIDENTS BULKY WASTE COLLECTION

A separate collection for these items will be made once a month during the First Full Week of the month, beginning on Monday, on your normal refuse collection day. Bulky items must be separated from other refuse and recyclables and placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m. for collection. The bulky waste collection for condominiums will be done once a month during the First Full Week of the month on Friday; items must be placed by the dumpsters by 7:00 a.m. for collection. It is not necessary for the condominium association or resident of the condominium to call the Public Works Department for bulky waste collection. Home improvement contractor generated building material wastes are not acceptable. For demolition waste, homeowner should make waste disposal arrangements with a private contractor.

Acceptable Items for Bulky Waste Collection are:

- Household Furniture (sofas, recliners, overstuffed chairs, sleeper sofas, etc.)
- •Bedding—Mattresses and Box Springs
- •Carpets, rugs (must be rolled, bundled & tied/secured (5 ft. max. width by 6 ft. length).
- Large plastic items (kids toys, storage bins)
- •Up to 4 car tires without the rims

Non-acceptable Items for Bulky Waste Collection are:

- Cardboard Boxes
- Covered Electronic Devices—Televisions, Computers, Monitors, Printers, etc. Scrap Metal (grills, bicycles, lawn mowers, bed frames, etc.)
- Home improvement or home remodeling generated building material wastes are not acceptable including: Doors, Windows, Kitchen Cabinets or Countertops, Bathtubs/shower, vanities; Flooring (tiles)
- Construction Material such as: lumber, sheetrock, shingles, plaster, pipe, sheds, fencing, dirt, stones and rocks, railroad ties, etc. Homeowner should make waste disposal arrangements with a private contractor.
- Bagged and/or loose trash of any type. Bulk waste is not collected in cardboard boxes or plastic bags.
