A Council member or the Mayor shall advise the rest of the Council in writing through the Clerk of the Council their objection to the email being read prior to the call of the meeting.

Virtual Meetings:

Public Input shall not exceed thirty (30) minutes unless extended by the Mayor with the consent of the majority of the Council present. When recognized by the Mayor, the speaker(s) shall approach the lectern, and give their name and address. Speakers shall avoid personal attacks or impugning or alleging an improper motive to any person. The speaker(s) may address the Council on any item on the agenda. The speaker(s) shall limit their speaking time to five (5) minutes. This limit may not be exceeded, except when invoked by any member of the Council with the consent of a majority of the Council present. WHEREAS, a purpose in forming the Park & Recreation Facility Planning and Implementation Committee was, among others, to identify and vet locations for the South Windsor Park and Recreation Department offices, as a result of its prior location in Wapping

WHEREAS, the Town Council has directed the Public Building Commission to coordinate with the Parks and Recreation Commission and Parks and Recreation Department to identify possible sites and building locations for the Park and Recreation Department offices

WHEREAS, the purposes of the Park & Recreation Facility Planning and Implementation Committee dated December 6, 2021, and further amended on February 7, 2022, are completed, and the Park & Recreation Facility Planning and Implementation Committee is hereby rescinded and that committee is hereby dissolved.

WHEREAS, the identification, study and recommendation of a location for the Park and Recreation Department offices should be assigned to the Public Building Commission, with the input from the Parks and Recreation Commission and the Parks and Recreation Department and in cooperation with the Town Planning and Zoning Commission, to recommend an appropriate location to the Town Council in accordance with the powers and duties provided to the Public Building Commission by Charter and by Ordinance §2-172.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that, the Public Building Commission is hereby directed to coordinate the receipt of recommendations from the Parks and Recreation Commission, the Town Manager, and the Director of Parks and Recreation Department, to identify a site and building location for the Parks and Recreation Department offices pursuant to the powers and duties of the Public Building Commission, and shall in cooperation with the Town Planning & Zoning Commission, recommend an appropriate site for the Parks and Recreation Department offices to the Town Council; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, the Park and Recreation Commission is hereby directed to coordinate with, and provide its recommendation and approval to, the Public Building Commission as to the identification of possible sites and building locations for the Park and Recreation Department offices; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, the Town Manager and Director of the Park and Recreation Department are hereby directed to coordinate with, and each provide their recommendation to, the Public Building Commission as to the identification of a proposed sites and building locations for the Park and Recreation Department offices; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, the Public Building Commission shall provide its report identifying a site and building location for the Parks and Recreation Department offices to the Town Council not later than a date set forth by the Town Council at the adoption of this resolution, such date being subject to future amendment by the Town Council.

2. Review the positions of Elected Officials in Article Four of the Town Charter for possible amendments to such positions, including addition or elimination of such positions.
3. Review of the manner of filling vacancies in elected office or appointed office, in particular the provisions of alternate seating and compliance with minority representation rules, in Article Four of the Town Charter for possible amendment.

4. Review the provisions of the Town Charter regarding the preparation, submission and adoption of the annual budget for possible modifications to the timing requirements and mandated meetings, including public hearings.
5. Review the powers, duties and jurisdiction of all Town Charter mandated boards, commissions and agencies as well as those created outside the Town Charter, with the consideration of possible amendment, consolidation or elimination.
6. Review the requirements for competitive bidding of the Town Charter to consider increasing the current bid requirement for expenditures in excess of \$2,500.00.
7. Review of the elected office of Treasurer with the consideration of the possible elimination of such position.

The review by the Charter Revision Commission is not restricted to the areas identified above.
