4. Mayor's Remarks

Mayor Delnicki noted that on January 15<sup>th</sup> Town Offices were closed in observance of Martin Luther King Jr. Day.

The mayor attended the South Windsor Community Chorus Annual Winter Concert. The concert was held at First Congregational Church on Main Street.

Councilor Carey made a motion to adopt the agenda as presented.

5. Adoption of Agenda

Councilor Lewis seconded the motion, which was approved by unanimous voice vote.

**6. Communications and Reports from the Town Manager**

Mr. Maniscalco reported that Town staff participated in a rating call with S&P on January 11<sup>th</sup>. The Town is expecting to receive the rating results from the committee on January 18<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Maniscalco recognized the Finance Department and all others that helped pull reports and information together to make the call a success.

Mr. Maniscalco recognized the Town Staff who helped with the storm clean up on Sunday and Tuesday.

On January 10<sup>th</sup>, the Town held its annual Tax Sale and auctioned off two properties that were delinquent in the amount of \$52, 924.74 and \$37,657.49 respectively. The Town was successful in collecting all those back taxes. The owners of the two properties have another six months to repay the taxes owed along with all associated fees.

Whole Foods is having its grand opening tomorrow, January 17<sup>th</sup> at 7:30am.

The Town is looking into the current motor vehicle tax cap. The State cap is about 32 mills. The State said they would create a grant to cover the delta between where the cap was and where the mill rate would be. The Town has received grants in the past, since the revaluation the mill rate has dropped. The grant would now be smaller. There are a number of other communities that are in the same situation. Municipalities are having challenges associated with loss of revenue from that smaller grant.

The council requested that Mr. Maniscalco gather data in regards to tax abatements, dating back to 2019. The question was; In terms of tax abatements, how much has been abated and how much is being brought in? There have been 10 million dollars' worth of abatements The Town has brought in 16.47 million.

Mayor Delnicki asked about the grand list. Mr. Maniscalco answered that there is still time until the assessor signs and releases the grand list. In terms of growth, due to the revaluation, all the values of the grand list remain. There is not much growth to be expected.

Mayor Delnicki mentioned that the State is looking into eliminating the motor vehicle tax altogether. Mr. Maniscalco explained that eliminating the motor vehicle tax would just mean that revenue would have to be generated elsewhere. The burden would be pushed on to property taxes.

Councilor Carey asked if the grand list for motor vehicles decreased, and therefore does the Town expect to collect less in taxes? Mr. Maniscalco answered from a value perspective, yes it has gone down. How much has yet to be determined as the grand list is not complete at this time.

Councilor Pendleton asked about a AAA+ rating. Mr. Maniscalco answered that that would be determined on the financial policies that are in place, such as the budget policy statement. Also insuring that the budget is managed effectively, making sure the budget is not surpassed. Legally the Town cannot go over budget, and lastly considering the general fund. The general fund would have to be able to sustain in the event that an unforeseen circumstance or a large



project. The town would be able to financially float those projects. There are some smaller finer points. The Town Manager is fairly confident that the Town will receive another AAA rating. Every year, when the town goes out to bond, the rating needs to be confirmed for when it goes out to market.

7. **Public Input for Items on the Agenda**

Public Input shall not exceed thirty (30) minutes. When recognized by the Mayor, the speaker(s) shall approach the lectern, give their name and address. Speakers shall avoid personal attacks or impugning or alleging an improper motive to any person. The speaker(s) may address the Council on any item on the agenda. The speaker(s) shall limit their speaking time to five (5) minutes.

Jason Smith, 49 Stevens Road spoke in favor of the proposed high school campus improvements. Mr. Smith supports sending this to referendum in March and not waiting until November where the cost could potentially be increased by 1 million.

Samantha Petgrave, 28 Simcka Drive, along with other community members went around town to ask residents about their opinion on the proposed high school campus improvements. Ms. Petgrave was able to collect about 500 signatures for those in support of the proposed high school campus improvements. Ms. Petgrave urges the council to send this project to referendum.

Eriz Mahan, 50 Henry Road, took a moment to address some the questions the council has asked throughout the past few council meetings in regards to the high school campus improvements. South Windsor High School currently belongs to class L with 21 other schools and they are the only school without a lighted field. Mr. Mahan supports sending the question to referendum.

Marek Kozikowski, 863 Clark Street, commented on the referendum question. Mr. Kozikowski believes it is a good project, however he believes that the language for said referendum question should be more specific. Mr. Kozikowski also references agenda item **13 F**, stating that there should be more specific language included in the public hearing notice. Mr. Kozikowski also references items **13 H** and **13 K**.

Joe Kennedy, 81 Alison Drive, commented on the proposed high school campus improvements and supports sending the project to referendum.

Craig Zimmerman, Board of Education, spoke on the proposed high school campus improvements for clarification. The basketball court will no be completely removed, it may just have to be placed at a different location, close to the school. Mr. Zimmerman addressed the language in the referendum question “or other town property”. This language was included to address the baseball field and possibly the basketball court that are not included on the high school campus.

Audrey Breen, 3 Murray Road, spoke on behalf of the proposed ordinance change to Chapter 66 Library to a Town Department instead of a grant agency. Ms. Breen is a resident, an Adult Services Librarian and the President of the Library Workers Union. Ms. Breen stated that the change to a Town Department will improve services. The current structure impedes budgetary

transparency and muddies the water in regards for whom the library staff actually work. The confusion extends to employee policies and who sets those policies.

Ray Paul, 29 Mohegan Trail, spoke about the proposed high school campus improvements and noted that there should be an additional tennis court to bring the total up to 8 tennis courts. Mr. Paul recommends including security cameras to discourage unauthorized users from using the field.

John Sexton., 15 City View Terrace, is one of the property owners on Collins Crossing. Mr. Sexton is concerned about the possible traffic issue. Mr. Sexton is in favor of the referendum.

Nicki Mahan, 50 Henry Road, stated her support for the referendum question. Mrs. Mahan stated that this plan is very thoughtful and thorough.

Mayor Delnicki made a motion to extend the time limit for public input. Councilor Carey seconded the motion, which was approved by unanimous voice vote. **MOTION CARRIES.**

Dan Edwards, read some comments from Mr. Jeff Trachtenberg, 111 Oxford Drive, a copy of which is attached.

David Hodge, 83 Muriel Drive, is in support of sending the question to referendum in March. Mr. Hodge mentioned that postponing this decision would increase the cost of this project. Mr. Hodge notes some safety and maintenance concerns associated with grass fields.

John, 34 Saint Mark Circle, spoke in support of the proposed high school campus improvements.

Councilor Buganski made a motion for the following:

8. **Adoption of Minutes of Previous Meeting**

Councilor Lewis seconded the motion, which was approved by unanimous voice vote. **MOTION CARRIES.**

9. **Communication from Liaisons, Officers, and Boards Directly Responsible to the Council**

Councilor Carey reported on the Planning & Zoning Commission. The commission met and discussed State of Connecticut requirements for a plan of Conservation Development be updated every 10 years. Planning & Zoning will have a meeting on Tuesday, January 30<sup>th</sup> at the Charles N. Enes Community Center.



Councilor King noted that the Social Justice & Racial Equity Commission will be hosting a Social Justice & Racial Equity Day on Saturday, January 24<sup>th</sup> from 10am – 2pm in the Friends Room at South Windsor Public Library.

Councilor Balboni reported on the Public Building Commission. January 8<sup>th</sup> PBC met with the Town Manager, Director of Parks and Rec., Chair of the Parks and Rec. Commission, and Clay Major, Director of Facilities for the Town. They discussed the existing Parks & Recreation Building, formerly known as Old Orchard Hill. The building needs to be brought up to code. The commission decided to contact Colliers to write an RFP and do a walk through, as necessary with architects to see if changes need to be made to accommodate the Parks & Rec program needs. Pleasant Valley is almost completely done, they did need to install a \$400,000 cell phone repeater to allow cell service at the school to accommodate a dead zone.

Mr. Maniscalco stated that he is waiting to hear back from the Chair of the Public Building Commission for a more concrete answer for the cost. Those monies are not allocated anywhere, so the commission would come back to the council asking to reallocate the monies from contingency or some other location.

Mr. Maniscalco addressed the cell tower at VMP. Marcus communications is working on a strategy to market the tower to cell phone carriers. To date, there is no update on this project.

Councilor Lewis reported on the Water Pollution Control Authority. Superintendent Manfre presented his first draft of the 2024/2025 fiscal year budget. Mr. Manfre highlighted the Sanitation Sewer Evaluation Study (SSES) that would identify areas for maintenance and repairs. Mr. Manfre also presented at a 10-year capital improvements plan. WPCA was awarded a grant of 1.3 million to address the odor control issue, thanks to the help of Senator Anwar and State Representative Tom Delnicki.

Councilor Lewis also reported on the Parks & Recreation Commission. The Patriotic Commission expressed their thanks to Parks & Rec. for their partnership in celebrating veterans. Both commissions have contributed to the funding of the trail projects for Walks and Wheel Ways. Councilor Lewis also noted that Genevieve Coursey is now the Chair of the Parks & Recreation Commission.

Mr. Maniscalco addressed Councilor Pendleton's questions regarding building codes at Old Orchard Hill. Mr. Maniscalco explained that the Public Building Commission would like to explore the Old Orchard Hill building, which was been permitted as a school. When you change the use of a facility there needs to be a number of upgrades that need to occur including; ADA compliance, fire code, building code, etc. That \$6,000 is an estimate for a study to be conducted at OOH. This is a study, not a brick and mortar improvement, that is why Capital funds cannot be used for the project.

**13. New Business**

**A. Discussion Item: Amendments to Chapter 66 Library  
Reference exhibit A.**

Mr. Maniscalco was directed by the previous council to look into this. There were past discussions regarding the transition for the Library to become a Town Department rather than a grant funded agency. Mr. Maniscalco was asked to complete a cost benefit analysis of what the transition would look like.

This is not a traditional cost benefit analysis as the Library is a grant funded agency. The Town provides several services to the Library in various forms including facility services, IT services, HR, administration etc. The Town does believe there would be some savings associated with the switch, due to redundancy in staff positions that exist now. There is the potential for more savings to be uncovered later.

The Town Attorney has drafted an ordinance that would create a similar scenario to the Parks & Recreations Advisory Board. There's a board that advises the director of the department. The director would manage the day to day, and report to the Town Manager. Mr. Maniscalco believes that this would create more transparency with the library, if it were to change over to a Town Department, specifically related to the budget. There have been difficulties in the past with the budgetary process.

From a procedural stand point, this is an ordinance. In order to modify the ordinance, the council would have to set a public hearing. After public input the council can pass the ordinance the same evening or wait for a future meeting to approve or modify the ordinance as the council sees fit. Once the ordinance is voted and approved, it would sit for 30 days before becoming a law.

There may be some delay with the transition to a Town Department as there are some IT issues that would need to be resolved. Mr. Maniscalco explained that in conversations with current Library Director, Mr. Sullivan, both agree that they do not wish the change the operations of the Library. This will help with the back-office services for the library that would be beneficial to the operations including; HR, finances, administration and more. The operations of the library should remain the same. Mr. Maniscalco explains that

Councilor Carey asked about including language for the library board to be included in the hiring process. Mr. Maniscalco explained that including that language may be contradictory to what is in the Charter. Mr. Maniscalco explained that going forward it is his intention to include the library board in the process. Including some representative from the library board, a representative from the public to sit in on those committees and processes.

Councilor Lewis voiced his concerns with the change. Councilor Lewis would like to ensure that the board of directors still be included in processes and have some ability to provide input.

Councilor Evans references past budget discussions. In the past there have been discrepancies with spending and line items and no oversight of the budget. The concern was that the library has budgeted for positions that have not been filled in some time.

Mr. Maniscalco explained that the Director of the Library, Mr. Sullivan would become a department head and have the same relationship that other department heads have with the Town Manager. The library would still be eligible for all library grants. There were some questions related to what the transition would look like. Mr. Maniscalco does have previous experience with another municipality that had a library operating as a town department. This dynamic created oversight and transparency.

Councilor Lewis made a motion for the following:

**B. Resolution authorizing the Water Pollution Control Authority to enter into an agreement with the State of Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection**

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Town of South Windsor may enter with and deliver to the State of Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection, any and all documents which it deems to be necessary or appropriate for a grant of \$1,300,000 for odor control improvements at the wastewater treatment plant located at 1 Vibert Road, South Windsor, Connecticut.

Councilor Pendleton seconded the motion, which was approved by unanimous voice vote. **MOTION CARRIES.**



Deputy Mayor Siracusa made a motion for the following:

**C. Resolution appropriating \$7,555,000 for the planning, design, acquisition, installation, construction, equipping and furnishing of campus improvements and new athletic facilities at South Windsor High School or other Town property and authorizing the issuance of \$7,555,000 bonds of the Town to meet said appropriation and pending the issuance thereof the making of temporary borrowings for such purpose, as shown in attached exhibit B**

Councilor Evans seconded the motion.

Deputy Mayor Siracusa expressed his support for the high school campus improvements. The Deputy Mayor was also concerned with the language “other Town property”.

Attorney Carella stated that the language included in the resolution was drafted by the bond council and addresses a concern that was brought up at a previous council meeting. The concern was, if there was left over monies from the project, could those left-over funds be used to address a different project. Specifically, in reference to the baseball field improvements at Eli Terry and the addition of a basketball court. The additional language of “other town property” was included to address those smaller projects that are not included in the high school campus improvements project. While, yes, technically the monies can be allocated to any other project, that is not the intent.

Mr. Maniscalco explained that if anyone in his position decided to use those funds for something other than its intended used, may very well be the end of said persons career. The council does have the authority to determine what happens with those left-over funds. Without that language, the council would still have to decide what happens with the potential left-over funds.

Councilor Evans expressed her support to send this to referendum. Councilor Evans suggested removing “other Town property” if that is the only cause of concern or hesitation. To postpone the referendum would be a disservice to the Town considering that residents have asked for this lighted field for decades. Postponing this decision will increase the cost.

Councilor Buganski asked for clarification in regards to bonding for the exact amount, up to the amount that is approved in the resolution.

Mr. Maniscalco explained that in his experience the bond council usually include that language with the intention to provide flexibility in order to not go out to referendum again. This language was previously used. The construction of Pleasant Valley was coming in over budget. There were saving from previous bond referendums for the other schools. The Board of Education came forward and requested that those savings from those other school projects be used to address the issues at Pleasant Valley. This is a similar situation.

The council agrees that the added language “other Town Property” could present an issue. The council discussed the possibility of removing that additional language or revising the language to be more specific.

Mr. Carella explained that bond resolutions are very specific. This language was added by the bond council. It was provided to give the council as much flexibility as they can have in relation to the

funds. In the event there is a need to move money, a project had savings and now those savings are going to be used somewhere else. The council has the ability to decide that.

Councilor Lewis made a motion to postpone the referendum until the Town has passed its annual budget. Councilor Carey seconded the motion.

The council expressed their desire to remain transparent with residents. The council also considered the cost increase that could be associated if the project was delayed. Bond interest rates are expected to decrease in the coming months. The council also considered that in the past, more residents show up to vote for a presidential election versus a referendum.

Councilor King called for the question. Councilor Carey seconded the motion.

Mayor Delnicki asked for a roll call vote for the motion to postpone the referendum question. The results of which are as follows; **5 ayes**, (Councilor Buganski, Councilor Lewis, Councilor Balboni, Councilor Carey, Mayor Delnicki) **4 nays**, (Deputy Mayor Siracusa, Councilor King, Councilor Evans, Councilor Pendleton) and **0 abstentions. MOTION CARRIES.**

Councilor King made a motion to remove items **13 D** and **13 E** from the agenda.

Councilor Carey seconded the motion, which was approve by unanimous voice vote. **MOTION CARRIES.**

**RESOLVED:** That the resolution entitled “Resolution Appropriating \$7,555,000 For The Planning, Design, Acquisition, Installation, Construction, Equipping And Furnishing Of Campus Improvements And New Athletic Facilities At South Windsor High School Or Other Town Property And Authorizing The Issuance Of \$7,555,000 Bonds Of The Town To Meet Said Appropriation And Pending The Issuance Thereof The Making Of Temporary Borrowings For Such Purpose”; heretofore at this meeting adopted, be submitted to the Town electors for approval or disapproval at a referendum to be held March 5, 2024, and that the warning of said referendum state the question to be voted upon as follows:

“Shall the resolution approving an appropriation and bond authorization in the amount of \$7,555,000 for the planning, design, acquisition, installation, construction, equipping and furnishing of campus improvements and new athletic facilities at South Windsor High School or other Town property, adopted by the Town Council on January 16, 2024, be approved?”

The ballot label for said question will read as follows:

“Shall the resolution appropriating and authorizing bonds in the amount of \$7,555,000 for the planning, design, acquisition, installation, construction, equipping and furnishing of campus improvements and new athletic facilities at South Windsor High School or other Town property be approved? Proposed Ordinance Amendment

Amendment to South Windsor Code of Ordinances regarding the Organization and Operations of the Town Public Library

WHEREAS, South Windsor Public Library was established by Town Meeting in October 1898; and

WHEREAS, per the Town Charter Section 502, the Town Council appoints a six-member Board of Directors, for four year terms, where three of the six members are appointed in alternating biennial cycles by the incoming newly elected Town Council; and

WHEREAS, the organization and operations of the Library has been under the direction of the Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors desires to have the organizational oversight and operations of the Library and its employees, transferred to the Town of South Windsor, to be managed under the office of the Town Manager; and

WHEREAS, the Town of South Windsor desires to maintain the Board of Directors to continue to recommend and advise the Town regarding the adoption of policies which will ensure that the Library shall continue to be free to all inhabitants of the Town in accordance with State law.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED THAT the South Windsor Town Council hereby amends the ordinance regarding the establishment, organization and Operations of the Town of South Windsor Public Library, as follows:

Chapter 66 LIBRARY

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Sec. 66-1. Public library.

- (a) A public library is established to be called the South Windsor Public Library, which shall under the proper regulations to be proposed by the directors and adopted by the Town directors be free to all the inhabitants of the town.
- (b) The town treasurer is authorized to receive such sums as may from time to time be paid to the town for library purposes ~~and to pay the sums upon order of the public library directors.~~

ARTICLE II. ORGANIZATION

Secs. 66-2 Library Department—~~66-35. Reserved.~~

- (a) The Town Manager shall establish a Library Department within the Town's department organizational structure and shall have oversight of all aspects of the operations of the library as a department of the Town of South Windsor.
- (b) The Town shall provide suitable space and rooms for public library purposes.
- (c) The Town Manager shall employ a Library Director who shall serve as advisor to the Board of Directors of the library and implement the policies of the Town and the library as directed by the Town Manager.
- (d) Library employees shall be considered Town employees, eligible to participate in all aspects of Town employee benefits.

Secs. 66-3-66-35. Reserved.

ARTICLE # III. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Sec. 66-36. Duties.

The directors shall recommend to the Town enact reasonable rules and regulations for the operation of the library, ~~shall provide for employees to maintain and operate the library and shall have general management of the same, and shall provide suitable rooms for public library purposes.~~

EXHIBIT B

RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING \$7,555,000 FOR THE PLANNING, DESIGN, ACQUISITION, INSTALLATION, CONSTRUCTION, EQUIPPING AND FURNISHING OF CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS AND NEW ATHLETIC FACILITIES AT SOUTH WINDSOR HIGH SCHOOL OR OTHER TOWN PROPERTY AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$7,555,000 BONDS OF THE TOWN TO MEET SAID APPROPRIATION AND PENDING THE ISSUANCE THEREOF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY BORROWINGS FOR SUCH PURPOSE

RESOLVED:

Section 1. The sum of \$7,555,000 is hereby appropriated by the Town of South Windsor, Connecticut (the "Town") for the planning, design, acquisition, installation, construction, equipping and furnishing of campus improvements and new athletic facilities at South Windsor High School or other Town property, including, but not limited to: (1) the construction and installation of (i) a lighted multi-purpose turf field; (ii) new tennis & pickleball courts; and (iii) a new entrance driveway; (2) related costs, including, but not limited to, expenses related to permitting, environmental and geological testing, earthwork, site work, installation of electrical, lighting, technology, security and other infrastructure, construction, reconstruction and improvement of parking areas, sidewalks, driveways and roads, including rebuilding, resurfacing, drainage, conduits, and related subsurface and infrastructure improvements, landscaping, construction or installation of concession facility, temporary parking and storage, relocation of existing facilities (including, but not limited to, basketball courts and little league fields), demolition, removal and replacement of unused infrastructure; and (3) related legal, consulting, licensing, advisory, administrative, governmental fees and expenses and costs of issuance related thereto, said appropriation being inclusive of any and all State and Federal grants-in-aid thereof (the "Project").

Section 2. To meet said appropriation, \$7,555,000 bonds of the Town or so much thereof as shall be necessary for such purpose, shall be issued, maturing not later than the maximum maturity permitted by the General Statutes of Connecticut, Revision of 1958, as amended from time to time (the "Connecticut General Statutes"). Said bonds may be issued in one or more series as determined by the Town Manager, provided that the total amount of bonds to be issued shall not be less than an amount which will provide funds sufficient, with other funds available for such purpose, to pay the principal of and the interest on all temporary borrowings in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of said bonds outstanding at the time of the issuance thereof, and to pay for the administrative, financing, legal and other costs of issuance of such bonds. The bonds shall be in the denomination of \$1,000 or a whole multiple thereof, be issued in fully registered form, be executed in the name and on behalf of the Town by the facsimile or manual signatures of the Town Manager and the Town Treasurer, bear the Town seal or a facsimile thereof, be certified by a bank or trust company, which bank or trust company may be designated the registrar and transfer agent, be payable at a bank or trust company, and be approved as to their legality by Robinson & Cole LLP, Hartford, Connecticut. The bonds shall be general obligations of the Town and each of the bonds shall recite that every requirement of law relating to its issue has been duly complied with, that such bond is within every debt and other limit prescribed by law, and the full faith and credit of the Town are pledged to the payment of the principal thereof and interest thereon. The aggregate principal amount of the bonds of each series to be issued, the annual installments of principal, redemption provisions, if any, the certifying, registrar and transfer agent and paying agent, the date, time of issue and sale and other terms, details and particulars of such bonds, including the approval of the rate or rates of interest, shall be determined by the Town Manager and Town Treasurer, in accordance with the Connecticut General Statutes.

Section 3. Said bonds shall be sold by the Town Manager in a competitive offering or by negotiation, in his discretion. If sold in a competitive offering, the bonds shall be sold at not less than par and accrued interest on the basis of the lowest net or true interest cost to the Town. A notice of sale or a summary thereof describing the bonds and setting forth the terms and conditions of the sale shall be published at least



five days in advance of the sale in a recognized publication carrying municipal bond notices and devoted primarily to financial news and the subject of state and municipal bonds. If the bonds are sold by negotiation, the purchase agreement shall be approved by the Town Manager and Town Treasurer.

Section 4. The Town Treasurer is authorized to make temporary borrowings in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of said bonds. Notes evidencing such borrowings shall be signed by the Town Manager and the Town Treasurer, have the seal of the Town affixed, be payable at a bank or trust company designated by the Town Manager, be approved as to their legality by Robinson & Cole LLP, Hartford, Connecticut and be certified by a bank or trust company designated by the Town Manager pursuant to Section 7-373 of the Connecticut General Statutes. The notes shall be issued with maturity dates which comply with the provisions of the Connecticut General Statutes governing the issuance of such notes. The notes shall be general obligations of the Town and each of the notes shall recite that every requirement of law relating to its issue has been duly complied with, that such note is within every debt and other limit prescribed by law, and that the full faith and credit of the Town are pledged to the payment of the principal thereof and the interest thereon. The net interest cost on such notes, including renewals thereof, and the expense of preparing, issuing and marketing, to the extent paid from the proceeds of such renewals or said bonds, shall be included as a cost of the Project. Upon the sale of the bonds, the proceeds thereof, to the extent required, shall be applied forthwith to the payment of the principal of and the interest on any such notes then outstanding or shall be deposited with a bank or trust company in trust for such purpose.

Section 5. The balance of any appropriation or the proceeds of any bonds or notes not needed to meet the cost of the Project authorized hereby may be transferred by the Town Manager, upon approval of the Town Council, to meet the actual cost of any other capital project of the Town (including capital projects authorized by prior or future bond resolutions) for which a valid appropriation and bond authorization has been adopted; provided that the aggregate amount of bonds authorized pursuant to such transfer shall not be increased.

Section 6. The Town hereby expresses its official intent pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Federal Income Tax Regulations, Title 26 (the "Regulations"), to reimburse expenditures paid sixty days prior to and any time after the date of passage of this resolution in the maximum amount of the Project with the proceeds of bonds, notes, or other tax-exempt obligations ("Tax-Exempt Obligations") authorized to be issued by the Town. The Tax-Exempt Obligations shall be issued to reimburse such expenditures not later than 18 months after the later of the date of the expenditure or the substantial completion of the Project, or such later date the Regulations may authorize. The Town hereby certifies that the intention to reimburse as expressed herein is based upon its reasonable expectations as of this date. The Town Treasurer or his/her designee is authorized to pay Project expenses in accordance herewith pending the issuance of the Tax-Exempt Obligations.

Section 7. The Town Manager and Town Treasurer are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Town, to enter into agreements or otherwise covenant for the benefit of bondholders to provide information on an annual or other periodic basis to the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (the "MSRB") and to provide notices to the MSRB of certain events as enumerated in Securities and Exchange Commission Exchange Act Rule 15c2-12, as amended, as may be necessary, appropriate or desirable to effect the sale of the bonds and notes authorized by this resolution. Any agreements or representations to provide information to MSRB made prior hereto are hereby confirmed, ratified and approved.

Section 8. The Town Manager and the Town Treasurer, or either of them, are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Town, to enter into any other agreements, instruments, documents and certificates, including tax and investment agreements, for the consummation of the transactions contemplated by this resolution. The Town Manager and the Town Treasurer, or either of them, are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Town, to apply for and accept any and all Federal and State loans and or grants-in-aid of the Project, to expend said funds in accordance with the terms hereof, and in connection therewith to contract in the name of the Town with engineers, contractors and others.

Section 9. The Board of Education is authorized in the name and on behalf of the Town to apply to the Connecticut Commissioner of Education for any and all State grants-in-aid of the Project.

Section 10. This resolution shall become effective upon its approval by the Town electors at a referendum called by the Town Council for such purpose.



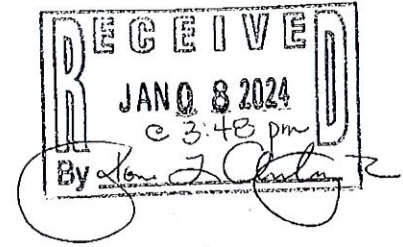
