Dear Neighbor,

As part of our everyday effort to deliver reliable energy to our customers and communities, we'll be replacing existing wood structures in East Windsor and South Windsor, Connecticut. Maintaining the infrastructure that supports electric lines is one of the many ways Eversource ensures the safe, secure transmission of electricity throughout the region.

Reliability Improvements in Your Neighborhood

We will be working in your area within the next couple of weeks. This maintenance work is taking place on the right of way that is on or near your property in East Windsor from Interstate 91 to Barber Hill Road in South Windsor.

What You Can Expect

First, we want you to know that this work will not interrupt electric service to your property, and that people working on the project carry proper identification at all times. Crews from PAR Electrical Contractors, Supreme Industries and Northern Tree will be working for Eversource to replace existing transmission structures located on or near your property.

There will be construction vehicles on the right of way, including heavy equipment, though we will make every effort to minimize any impact to your property. Project work may include site grading, mowing/vegetation removal, adding gravel to the access road, and setting removable timber mats.

We'll also replace existing wood structures with new, weathering steel structures of similar size. (Please see the typical work area photos at the end of this letter.) When the project is completed, crews will restore areas that were disturbed by the work.

Work hours will be Monday through Sunday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. This maintenance project is expected to be complete by the end of 2017, though some restoration work may take place in early 2018. Please keep in mind that the schedule may change due to weather and other unexpected circumstances.
