NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town hereby adopts and approves Amendment 18 to the Plan effective as of the various dates as shall be specified in the Amendment, on the condition that such Plan as amended continues to constitute a qualified plan of deferred compensation pursuant to Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended and that such Plan and any related trust continues to be tax exempt pursuant to Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Manager of the Town of South Windsor is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to execute Amendment 18 to the Plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Manager of the Town of South Windsor is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to do any and all acts and execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the foregoing resolutions.

WHEREAS, this type of cut to our community would jeopardize the financial condition of our Town, the quality of the education provided by our school system, and the level of basic services that our residents rely on; and

WHEREAS, other communities would be similarly negatively impacted by the Governor's Executive Order; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly failed to adopt a budget during its regular session; and

WHEREAS, the Governor has the authority to call a Special Session for the purpose of adopting a budget

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the South Windsor Town Council hereby requests the Governor to reverse his Executive Order dated August 18, 2017; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the South Windsor Town Council also requests that the Governor call for a Special Session which shall continue until a budget is passed.
