<u>Public Petitions</u> – A South Windsor Resident or Taxpayer may petition the Council to submit a new item on the agenda as described in Section 312 of the Town Charter.

Item #12:

<u>Public Participation</u> – A segment of up to twenty (20) minutes (which may be extended by the Mayor with consent of the Council) is set aside to hear from the public on any matter **on the agenda**. Speaker(s) generally are to limit their comments to three (3) minutes each, and shall avoid personalities or impugning or improper motive to any person.

A. Resolution Adopting the Board of Education Budget for Fiscal Year 2019/2020

BE IT RESOLVED that the South Windsor Town Council hereby adopts a Board of Education Budget with expenditures totaling **\$75,399,351**; for the Fiscal Year commencing on July 1, 2019 and terminating on June 30, 2020, a copy of which Budget is on file in the Office of the Town Clerk.

B. Resolution Adopting the Budget for the Special Revenue Recreation Fund for Fiscal Year 2019/2020

BE IT RESOLVED that the South Windsor Town Council hereby adopts a Special Revenue Recreation Fund Budget with expenditures totaling **\$3,221,416**; for Fiscal Year commencing on July 1, 2019, and terminating on June 30, 2020.

C. Resolution Adopting the General Government Budget for Fiscal Year 2019/2020

D. Resolution Setting the Tax Rate for Fiscal Year 2019/2020 (Deputy Mayor Pendleton)

BE IT RESOLVED that the tax rate of <u>38.50</u> mills be levied on the Grand List of October 1, 2018 based upon Total Revenues excluding current taxes of <u>\$17,669,901</u>, which includes an appropriation from Fund Balance in the amount of <u>\$200,000</u> and an appropriation from the Tax Stabilization Fund in the amount of <u>\$500,000</u> to finance total expenditures of <u>\$122,626,358</u> made up of a Board of Education Budget of <u>\$75,399,351</u> and a General Government Budget of <u>\$47,227,007</u>, both of which have been adopted by the South Windsor Town Council, and exhibits of which are on file in the Office of the Town Clerk for the Fiscal Year commencing on July 1, 2019, and terminating on June 30, 2020.

E. Resolution Appointing a Rate Maker for Fiscal Year 2019/2020 and the Tabling of Same
