WHEREAS, part of the intended natural buffer of existing trees south of the Barton property entrance along Brookfield Street unexpectedly failed to survive; and

WHEREAS, it was decided by the Barton Project staff that a man-made earthen berm with new tree plantings be put in its place; and

WHEREAS, neighbors that are affected by this have been assured that correct measures are being planned; and

WHEREAS, the estimated contracted cost for this project is \$40,612; and

WHEREAS, Environmental Services, Inc. has volunteered to partner with the Town in order to resolve this buffer issue; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost if the Town partners with Environmental Services, Inc. for this project is \$11,750; and

WHEREAS, the partnership with Environmental Services, Inc. will save the Town an estimated \$28,862

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the South 'Windsor Town Council hereby waives the competitive bidding process as described in Section 714 of the Town's Charter, for the construction of a berm at the Fairgrounds at Rye Street Park (Barton Property) and authorizes the Town of South Windsor to partner with Environmental Services, Inc. to correct this buffer issue.

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Town of South Windsor and its citizens to actively identify homes with foundation problems; and

WHEREAS, it is also in the best interest of the Town and its citizens to work together to protect current homes and home owners as well as future homes and home owners from the challenges of crumbling basements; and

WHEREAS, the Lieutenant Governor at the request of the Governor has created a State of Connecticut Task Force to address this challenge at the level of the State, and this includes the Department of Consumer Protection along with members of the Attorney General's Office and Legislators to study and develop a plan to address this disaster; and

WHEREAS, the challenges at the level of the local community in South Windsor are very substantial, that there is an acute need to have a committee based in South Windsor to help identify the true impact and the collective effect to the Town and help in studying solutions to the disaster locally; and

WHEREAS, it is determined that it is in the best interests of the Town that a temporary committee to address the disaster of crumbling foundations in South Windsor be formed pursuant to the following:

- 1. The committee shall consist of eleven (11) members who shall be appointed by the Town Council. The members of the committee shall include at least two (2) members of the Town Council, the Chief Building Official of the Building Department, a representative from the Assessor's Department, a representative from the Planning Department, a representative from the Human Services Department, and five (5) additional members of the public representing the community members who have been impacted by the crumbling basements; and
- 2. The committee shall select a Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and Secretary at its first meeting following the start of the next month; and
- 3. The committee shall be established for a minimum of three-years from this day (March 7, 2016) unless extended by the Town Council; and
- 4. The committee shall have the following duties and responsibilities:
 - a. Help educate the community on the current status of the disaster within the Town of South Windsor.

- b. Develop a plan to help prevent a similar disaster from occurring in the future.
- c. Educate South Windsor residents about individuals, groups and some businesses who are preying on the victims of the disaster.
- d. Identify appropriate Federal and State incentive and grant programs that provide opportunities for helping the victims of the disaster.
- e. Develop a resource and support system within the Town to help the victims at the various levels of the impact of the disaster.
- f. Help develop an understanding on the reduction in value of the homes impacted by the disaster.
- g. The committee shall serve in an advisory capacity only and its recommendations shall not bind the Town to take any specific action or require that it appropriate any funds; and
- 5. All of the meetings and records of the committee shall be in compliance with applicable State Statutes; and
- 6. A status report shall be provided by the committee to the Town Council on a quarterly basis or as may be directed by the Town Council

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the South Windsor Town Council hereby establishes a Temporary Committee to address the disaster of crumbling foundations in South Windsor, provide advice to the Town Council regarding ways to address the challenges of the crumbling foundations in South Windsor and make recommendations in accordance with the duties and responsibilities set forth herein.

WHEREAS, water is vital to our existence and that of plants, animals and our environment; and

14. P. (Continued)

WHEREAS, we are fortunate that in our State we have access to safe and clean drinking water and sanitation; and

WHEREAS, our water sources are subject to pollution from industrial, agricultural, sewage and storm water runoff; and

WHEREAS, there are significant costs incurred in maintaining adequate supplies of safe and clean drinking water, which costs are borne by customers; and South Windsor residents have been obligated by water companies to pay not only for the cost of safe water, but also for the cost of maintaining the water supply infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, there are approximately 1,800 South Windsor homes which depend upon Metropolitan District Commission (MDC) for their water; and MDC imposes a "surcharge" which had increased manifold over the past few years, and municipalities have engaged in litigation against MDC to ensure that such surcharges are reasonable; and

WHEREAS, MDC customer fees should be directed at ensuring a reliable source of clean water and a stable water delivery infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, MDC has announced a plan to sell water to Niagara Bottling, at a discounted rate; and to divert valuable water supplies paid for by MDC customers to this bottling business venture which will be subsidized by MDC customers; and

WHEREAS, MDC's business venture with Niagara Bottling includes the construction of a 443,000 square-foot water bottling plant in Bloomfield and the diversion of up to 1.8 million gallons of water per day; and

WHEREAS, MDC has a legal obligation to put its customer needs first and foremost, rather than its desire to sell customer subsidized water to a private business

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the South Windsor Town Council, on behalf of its MDC water customers, directs the Town Manager to contact the MDC Board urging them to develop a priority plan for customers in a situation of drought, where the residential customers are given priority over any for-profit venture, and the cost of water to any for-profit entity should not be less than what is being charged to the South Windsor residents; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the South Windsor Town Council, on behalf of the MDC water customers, directs the Town Manager to contact the Governor and State Elected Officials to seek legislation prohibiting MDC from diverting customer subsidized water to a private business; prohibit MDC from depleting valuable water resources; ensure that MDC meets its customer obligations to ensure safe and clean drinking water; and maintain the water supply infrastructure.
