WHEREAS, an appraisal of the easement was performed and the value of the easement was determined to be \$9,000; and

WHEREAS, the required public hearing was held on March 21, 2016

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the South Windsor Town Council hereby grants a permanent easement to Eversource Energy for access to their right of way on the Priest Property for the appraised fee of \$9,000.

WHEREAS, a State of Connecticut grant in the amount of \$75,000 administered through the D.E.E.P. has been awarded; and

WHEREAS, the estimated contracted cost of this project would be \$159,700; and

WHEREAS, numerous local contractors have volunteered to partner with the Town to provide free labor and equipment, and materials at cost, to complete this project; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost if the Town partners with these local contractors for this project is \$100,600; and

WHEREAS, sealed bids would not be in the best interest of the Town
