Answering questions from the Council, Mr. Galligan stated that the Town Manager would designate the Town staff that would enforce this ordinance. Mr. Galligan said he would probably designate the Health Department. The Town Attorney drafted this ordinance.

Councilor Snyder stated that in this ordinance under Legislative Authority there is language that is subjective. It may be facts at this time, but in the future it may not apply, and wondered if it is necessary to have this language in the ordinance. Mr. Galligan stated that the language is explaining the intent for this ordinance. In the future, the State of Connecticut may move forward with legislation on this issue.

Councilor Snyder felt that the intent could be put in the ordinance, but the remainder of the language could be deleted. Mr. Galligan suggested that at the public hearing, the Council request that this language be taken out when the Town Attorney is present.

Councilor Hockenberry explained that this language tells the history of why the policy is being brought forward.

Answering further questions, Mr. Galligan explained that as long as there are not drastic changes to the ordinance, it could be done at the public hearing without requiring an additional public hearing.

One of my initiatives while serving on the Town Council and as Mayor, was suggesting and following through on our town's implementation of a textile recycling program. In one year about 18 tons of textiles and shoes were saved from dumping and were recycled through placement in various bins located around town at our schools recreation department and community center. The places which host these recycling containers get their share of \$100 per ton in rebates.

The numbers aren't all in yet but as of the end of October the rebates are:

TE: \$197

Eli Terry: \$144.50 Orchard Hill: \$238.25

PRS: \$142.50 PV: \$355.25

Comm center: \$320.25

Rec center: \$340

Total rebate: \$1737.75.

Tony Manfre, our Superintendent of Pollution Control, told me that the projection for 2019 is 20 tons. I wonder how much this saves in our tipping fees for garbage collection. Many people I speak to are still unaware of this textile recycling program.

For many years our Town Manager, Matthew Galligan, has always bragged with pride that the South Windsor community is one of the best towns in regards to recycling. But I find there is still some degree of uncertainty of about what is exactly is recyclable and what people put in recycling (in an effort to be eco-conscious) that can contaminate the recycling process rendering it ineffective. I believe that education is power and that we can do better before considering drastic measures. If film type bags,

bottle caps, wrapping paper, pizza boxes, and other items are still put in recycling that could possibly contaminate the whole batch, it defeats the purpose and good intentions. I would not want to see more questionable items going to recycling when there's a pay per bag fee.

I also let Mr. Manfre know my thoughts of promoting a townwide campaign to educate residents and provide materials to help us all do better in in our efforts as a community to minimize waste and increase recycling in an efficient manner to reduce costs. I know there are some community groups that would help promote the effort. I'm in favor of setting a baseline and goal to work towards before considering radical change. Our residents deserve the opportunity.
