A. Resolution Referring the Sale of 725 Sullivan Avenue to the South Windsor Planning & Zoning Commission Pursuant to Section 8-24 of the Connecticut General Statutes and Authorizing the Town Manager to Sign and Execute an Agreement with JP RE Holdings, LLC (Postponed from the March 29, 2021, Town Council Special Meeting)

WHEREAS, the Town of South Windsor purchased property located at 725 Sullivan Avenue on December 31, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the Town of South Windsor has received an offer to purchase 725 Sullivan Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Town of South Windsor received an appraisal in the amount of \$265,000, which JP RE Holdings, LLC has agreed to pay contingent upon all municipal approvals; and

WHEREAS, the buyer has presented preliminary plans for the construction and operation of a medical office building which will generate additional tax dollars; and

WHEREAS, any plan to sell municipal-owned property must first be submitted to the South Windsor Planning & Zoning Commission for a report pursuant to Section 8-24 of the Connecticut General Statutes

At the April 5, 2021 regularly scheduled Town Council meeting the Town Council voted to have the Mayor and Town Manager sign and send this letter to you.

With the Governors emergency powers lapsing on May 20, 2021 the Town Council is strongly urging the State Legislature to continue the executive orders that pertain to virtual public meetings. Many of the members of the Council have concerns regarding getting back together in person. Some of those concerns are as follows:

- Council Members have health concerns that may be exasperated in the event they are exposed to COVID-19;
- Council Members have family members in their households with high levels of risk if exposed to COVID-19;
- Towns facilities are barely adequate for social distancing during any public meeting;
- Including public participation also means an increased exposure to other town staff in the building and facilities within the building
- Following social distancing guidelines will significantly limit public participation in our meetings;
- There will be increased costs to the Town for cleaning and staffing of the public facility.

For these reasons and many more we ask that you take the appropriate steps to pass legislation to allow for virtual public meetings until we can feel safe from the risks COVID-19 poses on us during in person public meetings.
