PURPOSE: To receive citizen on the Financing of the Emergency
Operations Center

Mayor Anwar called the Public Hearing to order at 8:00 p.m.; and requested that the Clerk of the Council read the call of the meeting (a copy of which is attached hereto, **Exhibit A**). There were approximately twenty-four (24) people present in the audience.

Mr. Jay Gonzalez and Mr. Clay Major presented the plan and financing of the Emergency Operations Center, as shown in attached, **Exhibit B**.

Mayor Anwar asked if there was anyone from the public that would like to speak.

Mr. Don Gonsalves, 40 Bayberry Trail came before the Town Council and explained that there are a lot of taxpayers who can not afford to pay more taxes and he feels the Emergency Operations Center should be housed at the Fire Station on West Road.

Mr. Gary Roderick, 75 High Street came forward to speak in opposition to the financing of the Emergency Operations Center. Mr. Roderick feels this is unnecessary use of taxpayers money. The Fire Department on West Road is underutilized and could be used for an Emergency Operations Center.

Mr. Scott Fine, Division Chief with the South Windsor Volunteer Fire Department explained that the Fire Department is in full support of this project for the Emergency Operations Center.

Mr. Jeff Hamm, 577 Barber Hill Road came forward to encourage the Town Council to fully support this project.

Mr. Ryan Peck, Assistant Chief of the Volunteer Fire Department explained that the present Emergency Operations Center is currently a room at the Police Department which is not sufficient because there are a lot of conversations going on and it gets very loud. The proposed Emergency Operations Center has other rooms besides the large meeting room where other functions can be conducted. Mr. Peck stated that he is happy to see in the plan that the building will also be used for a Town Hall Annex and will house Town employees which will help to alleviate overcrowding at the Town Hall.


