PUBLIC HEARING MINUTES

June 6, 2016 8:30 p.m.

South Windsor Town Council

PURPOSE: To receive citizen input on a Non-Emergency Interagency Agreement between the Towns of South Windsor, Manchester and Vernon

Mayor Delnicki called the Public Hearing to order at 8:30 p.m.; and requested that the Clerk of the Council read the call of the meeting (a copy of which is attached hereto, **Exhibit A**). There were approximately thirteen (13) people present in the audience.

Chief Edwards, South Windsor Police Department came before the Council an explained that South Windsor, Manchester and Vernon recognize that a joint participation agreement between the three Towns are necessary for the effective delivery of police services in all three Towns. This agreement has been in place with Manchester since 2008. this agreement provides the authority for each town to work in each others Town and eliminates any concerns or questions as to the authority to act in the respective Town. There is an Oversight Committee established consisting of all three Police chiefs if there are any incidents or problems.

Chief James Kenny, Vernon Police Department informed the Council that Vernon's Council and Mayor have already signed off on this agreement, as well as Manchester. Threats are different these days and more police presence is needed at different venues to make sure there are no issues. This agreement will give Vernon Police Officers the same responsibilities and rights as a South Windsor Police Office when attending South Windsor events. If a crime is witnessed, they can act as a certified officer should.

Deputy Chief Custer, South Windsor Police Department felt this is a valuable agreement which will allow all three departments to provide better services and possibly more services.

Town Attorney Yagaloff stated that after reviewing the agreement, he feels the agreement is in the Town's best interest.

Mayor Delnicki asked if there was anyone from the public that would like to speak, there was none.

Mayor Delnicki asked for a Straw Vote, the results of which were as follows:
