1. Call Meeting to Order

Mayor Anwar called the Regular Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Deputy Mayor Paterna made a motion to suspend the rules in order to bring Agenda Item 14. B. forward. Councilor Snyder seconded the motion, and it was approved, unanimously.

14. Unfinished Business

B. Resolution Appointing Karen Lydecker (D) to the South Windsor Town Council

BE IT RESOLVED that the South Windsor Town Council hereby appoints Karen Lydecker (D) to the South Windsor Town Council for a term ending November 11, 2019, to fill the unexpired term of Jeffrey Glickman.

The motion was approved, unanimously

Councilor Lydecker was sworn in by Lori Trahan, Town Clerk.

Councilor Lydecker thanked her husband, the Town Council, and the citizens of the Town for giving her this opportunity.

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ITEM:

5. Communications and Reports from Town Manager

Mr. Galligan reported on the following:

- Tonight there is a resolution for a tax fixing agreement for Scannell Properties which is Coca-Cola Bottling Company. Presently the land is used for farming and the taxes collected on these parcels of property are approximately \$7,000. After the closing, the land value will go to about \$2.1 million which will generate about \$56,000 in new taxes to the Town. Even if the Town gives a 70% abatement over seven years, the Town will get \$125,000 coming into the Town on that abatement which is the Town's 30%. The personal property will generate \$367,848. In the first year when the company is on the assessment role, the Town will receive \$549,523 in new taxes. Over a ten year period, the anticipated tax revenues are about \$4.8 million for the real property, the abatement for seven years is \$2.3 million, so the new real property taxes over a ten year period would be \$2.4 million. The personal property with depreciation will be \$2.1 million which means over a ten year period, the Town is looking at \$4.6 million of new tax revenue coming in. These numbers do not include the trucks as well as other furniture and fixtures. If this cannot be done, Coca-Cola will have to move to Needham, MA because East Hartford could not expand. This abatement is two communities working together to save jobs. There has been approval from DEEP and stormwater management planning will begin. An application will have to go to the Water Pollution Control Authority which will be heard on November 7th. Where the sewer line is proposed to go will enhance South Windsor's infrastructure. In the future, a pump station may be necessary.
- At the CCM Conference, the Waste Zero Program was discussed which is a new way to pick up garbage. DEEP as well as CCM are looking at a program which is almost like a pay as you go program where recycling will be broken up to avoid contamination. The Water Pollution Control Authority and Town staff will be discussing this program.
- At the CCM Conference, Mr. Galligan announced that he received two awards, the Joel Cogen Lifetime Achievement Award and the Richard Lee Innovators Award. Mr. Galligan thanked Councilor Snyder for submitting his name for these awards and stated he was honored.

5. Communications and Reports from Town Manager (Continued)

Answering questions from the Council, Mr. Galligan explained that in spite of the tax abatement, the Town would receive \$549,000 per year in property taxes. After the seven-year period, the Town will receive approximately \$300,000 more per year. They would like to start the ground work for this project before the winter.

Council members congratulated Mr. Galligan on his awards as well as Michele Lipe for her role with Sustainable CT which the Town received a Bronze Award. Mr. Galligan informed the Council that the Town also received a regionalization award for the EOC.

Mr. DeMallie stated that the project had received DOT approval as well as IWA/CC and the Planning and Zoning Commission approvals. The DEEP Stormwater District permit has been submitted tonight, and it is hopeful for an accelerated timeframe of 16 days. Construction will hopefully begin mid-month. Design Professionals prepared an engineered site plan, and part of that is the stormwater drain system which has already been approved by the Inland Wetlands Agency/Conservation Commission, Planning and Zoning, and the Town Engineer. It is now going to the DEEP for a stormwater discharge permit for construction activities which is required with any large land development project.

Mr. Galligan informed the Council the Phillip R. Smith Elementary School would be open November 6th for voting.

Councilor Pendleton questioned if the Town could work with DOT to ensure that tractor-trailer trucks do not use residential roads to get to and from the Scannell property. Mr. DeMallie stated that trucks would be coming to and from I-291 so Route 5 will be used.

Mayor Anwar stated that this is a good project and he would encourage the Council to support it. Mayor Anwar then asked the Town Manager about the letter from residents who are concerned about speeding vehicles on Laurel Street and other residential side streets in Town. Mr. Galligan stated that he shared this concern with the Chief of Police and the Traffic Division will be out there to do counts.

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6. Public Input (Items Not on the Agenda)

Mr. Roy Normen, Homestead Drive, came before the Council and congratulated Councilor Lydecker on her appointment to the Council and Mr. Galligan on receiving awards through CCM. Mr. Normen explained that he was present to help push for people to vote for the open space referendum tomorrow. This will help the Town complete its open space planning. Mr. Normen also encouraged resident to vote for the State referendum which would require stricter rules for open space.

Mr. Art Sladyk, 89 Pierce Road, and a member of the South Windsor Patriotic Commission and American Legion came before the Council to announce that on Sunday, November 11, 2018, there will be a ceremony at Veteran Memorial park at 11:00 a.m.

Mrs. Maureen Sheridan from the YWCA Region, came before the Council to announce that the YWCA made an asset purchase of the Mother Goose Daycare Center. The name has changed to The YWCA South Windsor Early Learning Center.

Mrs. Jill Marini, YWCA Region, explained that there are currently 50 spaces available for the before and after-school program. The center is working with the school system to work out the bussing situation.

C. Resolution Approving Offer of a Tax Assessment Agreement with Scannell

WHEREAS, a Request for a Tax Abatement has been received from Scannell, the owner of property at 359 Ellington Road, South Windsor, CT; and

WHEREAS, the Town of South Windsor's Tax Partnership Program established pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 12-65b, is intended to encourage the development and expansion of quality businesses in Town through tax and other economic incentives, and is designed to retain and attract businesses that will generate substantial additional tax revenues and employment opportunities for the Town while providing quality goods and services; and

WHEREAS, the Town Manager recommends, pursuant to said program, that a tax assessment agreement be offered to Scannell as an incentive to invest an estimated \$42,437,200 in total costs, including construction of a new building in South Windsor (the land and building improvements collectively referred to as the "Real Property")

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the South Windsor Town Council is pleased to offer a tax assessment agreement between the Town and Scannell reducing the amount of the estimated real property assessment of the Real Property by 70% for a period of seven (7) years with an estimated tax benefit reduction of \$341,479 annually, commencing with the Grand List following the date of the Certificate of Occupancy is issued; provided, however, that if such assessment is changed by any future Town revaluation, the new assessment value of the Real Property shall be reduced by the percentage applicable to the year within the seven (7) year period such assessment is changed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the South Windsor Town Council's offer to Scannell is conditioned upon Scannell (1) meeting the estimated \$42,437,200 construction cost figure and agreeing to the estimated assessment figure; and (2) continuing to pay the real estate taxes on the Facility for a minimum of ten (10) years from the date the Certificate of Occupancy is issued; if Scannell fails to meet either of these conditions, Scannell shall refund the Town of South Windsor all of the tax benefit reductions it has received; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the South Windsor Town Council's offer is contingent upon Scannell's execution of a written agreement reflecting the terms set forth in the resolution and such other terms as the Town may require.

Answering questions from the Council, Mr. Galligan stated that there would be 25 new jobs in East Hartford. All of the distribution jobs will move to South Windsor. This facility consists of 21,000 sq. ft. for sales and office so there will be new sales positions and secretary positions. Mr. Galligan felt the statement in the resolution, "continuing to pay the real estate taxes on the Facility for a minimum of ten (10) years", should remain at ten years because this is what has been used in the past, they are committing a lot to this project, and they have been a long-term resident of the State of Connecticut.
