A. Discussion Item: Public Act 19-171 – An Act Concerning the Property Tax Exemptions for Service Members and Veterans Having Disability Ratings (requested by Councilor Delnicki) (Mary Huda, Town Assessor to be present)

Deputy Mayor Pendleton recused herself from this discussion.

Councilor Delnicki explained that Public Act 19-171 is concerning a property tax exemption for service members and veterans having disability ratings. Councilor Delnicki requested that Mary Huda, the Town Assessor, explain the special local option exemption.

Mrs. Mary Huda, Town Assessor, explained that the Assessor's Office administers all of the veteran's exemptions and applies them to the Grand List, annually whether that is to real estate property or motor vehicle property. Human Services does all of the intakes for all of the income-related programs and gives that information to the Assessor's Office to be applied properly. In the 2018 Grand List, there are 729 veterans that receive benefits on one of those two types of property bills. In the past July billing, there were an additional twenty-five active duty service members that received exemptions on their motor vehicle bill. Of those 729, there are 180 that have disability ratings on file in the Assessor's Office, with some of those being incomequalified and some of those being non-income qualified. The Town already

adopts and puts in place the disability ratings we well as the over 65, which brings them to the highest level of exemptions, then the Town applies that on the local option.

Answering questions from the Council, Mrs. Huda stated that there is no need to change the Town's ordinance because the Town already administers the local option exemption, and when the State exemptions change, our local option follows the State if they are income qualified. The Town does some outreach to eligible individuals through Human Services, and any time someone reports their discharge paperwork with the Town Clerk, the process is started for them to receive their exemptions. Veterans Affairs does a good job of letting veterans know about all of the benefits that are available to them.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO ORDINANCE #225

South Windsor Volunteer Fire Tax Abatement Ordinance

- Sec. 1 <u>Purpose</u>: In recognition of the benefits provided to the Town of South Windsor by the dedicated service of the Town's Volunteer Fire personnel, the South Windsor Town Council herby establishes a tax abatement program pursuant to the authority granted by Connecticut General Statutes 12-81w for Volunteer Fire personnel on the conditions outlined below.
- Sec. 2 <u>Eligibility</u>: Members of the South Windsor Volunteer Fire Department and who reside and pay property tax in the Town of South Windsor shall be eligible when meeting the following criteria:
 - 1) Member must have achieved two years of service by July 1 of the current year to be eligible for a tax abatement on July 1 of the following year; and
 - 2) Member must have achieved a "good year" as defined by the Service Award Program. Any amendment to this definition must be approved by the Town Council in the same manner as an amendment to an ordinance.
- Sec. 3 <u>Certification:</u> Annually, on or before May 15th of each year, the Chief of the South Windsor Volunteer Fire Department shall certify and submit to the Town Manager and Finance Director, a list of the members of their organization who are eligible as defined in Section 2. This list shall contain addresses and the amount of which each member is eligible. For the year 2018 only, the list shall be submitted on or before June 1st in order to timely apply tax benefit to current bills.
- Sec. 4 <u>Abatement Schedule</u>: Abatement of property taxes shall be granted the following July 1st to eligible members as follows:
 - If a member has completed two years of service as of the July 1st preceding the date
 of abatement, the member shall be entitled to 25% of the maximum amount allowed
 by Connecticut General Statutes, as amended from time to time, as an annual
 abatement of property taxes
 - 2) If a member has completed five years of service as of July 1st preceding the date of abatement, the member shall be entitled to 50% of the maximum amount allowed by Connecticut General Statutes, as amended from time to time, as an annual abatement of property taxes
 - 3) If a member has completed seven years of service as of the July 1st preceding the date of abatement, the member shall be entitled to 75% of the maximum amount allowed by Connecticut General Statutes, as amended from time to time, as an annual abatement of property taxes

- 4) If a member has completed ten years of service or more as of the July 1st preceding the date of abatement, the member shall be entitled to 100% of the maximum amount allowed by Connecticut General Statutes, as amended from time to time, as an annual abatement of property taxes.
- Sec. 5 Retirement Benefit: Members who have served a minimum of twenty years and who have reached the mandatory retirement age of their organization shall continue to receive an abatement of \$1,000 annually for as long as they continue to reside and own property in South Windsor. Members who retire prior to the mandatory age and have over 25 years of credited "Good Years" in the Department's Service Award program shall continue to receive an abatement of \$1,000 annually for as long as they continue to reside and own property in South Windsor.
- Sec. 6 <u>Disability Benefit</u>: If for any reason, a member should become disabled due to an injury sustained in the performance of their duties within the Department, they shall be entitled to receive an abatement of \$1,000 annually for as long as they continue to reside and own property in South Windsor and continue to be so disabled.
- Sec. 7 <u>Construction of Ordinance</u>: Taxes to be abated must be those taxes imposed on real property or personal property assessed in the name of the eligible individual, either as a sole owner or a joint owner, but not by a corporation, LLC or partnership. In the case of abating taxes on real property, the real property must serve as the eligible individual's primary residence.
 - 1) The abatement amount shall be applied first to the taxes for real property, then to personal property which shall include motor vehicles leased to an eligible individual as of October 1 of any given year. In the event that the tax to which the abatement is applied is paid in installments, then the exemption shall be applied 50% to each installment.
 - 2) This ordinance shall not be construed to imply that if an eligible member has less tax liability than their permitted amount of tax abatement that they are entitled to receive any additional funds from the Town of South Windsor under this ordinance. In no event will this ordinance authorize a tax refund for taxes that have already been paid.
 - 3) No individual shall be eligible for participation in this property tax relief program if the individual has any tax delinquency, including taxes, interest, fees and any other charges, to the Town of South Windsor on the date of certification set forth above.

ARTICLE V - AGENDA

Section 1 - Preparation

- a. The Clerk of the Council shall be responsible for preparing the Agenda for all meetings of the Council and shall see that copies are distributed to the Members at least forty-eight (48) hours before the meeting.
- b. During the preparation of the Agenda, there shall be an Agenda Meeting with the Mayor or their designee, the Minority Leader or their designee, the Town Manager or their designee, and the Clerk of the Council or their designee for the purpose of all parties receiving the agenda information at the same time. The Clerk of the Council shall be responsible for preparing and distributing a schedule of times and dates for the Agenda Meetings to the members as listed. The Agenda Meetings shall be at least ninety-six (96) hours before the meeting and at least forty-eight (48) hours before the actual distribution of the agenda to all Members of the Council.
- c. Items for the Agenda of any meeting of the Council may be submitted at the prior meeting of the Council by the Mayor, the Members, Town Manager, and the Town Attorney.
- d. Additional items for the Agenda may be made by the above persons provided that all such additions be supplied to the Clerk of the Council at least five (5) business days prior to the meeting for which they are intended for consideration. The name of the person submitting an item for Council consideration shall appear on the Agenda after the item submitted.
- e. No item not on the Agenda for a Regular Meeting or Work Session may be taken up at said meeting except as provided in Article XIII, Section 1.
- f. A newspaper or newspapers having a general circulation in the Town shall be advised by the Clerk of the Council on the Agenda for a Council Meeting open to the Public at least forty-eight (48) hours before said meeting.
- g. The Clerk of the Council will provide a list of the New Business Agenda items, as submitted to the Clerk under these Rules, intended for consideration at the next meeting to the Town Council members by email or fax at least three (3) business days prior to the meeting. However, errors, delays, and/or unintentional omissions of the items will not prevent the Council from taking up the items at the Council Meeting, so long as the items are taken up as otherwise provided under these Rules.
- h. The Agenda shall contain the following notice: (Amended by Resolution on April 17, 2017)

Public Meetings are the time and place at which the Town Council conducts official business of the Town. The Council reserves time and invites the public to be heard during Public Input, Public Petitions, Public Participation and Public Input/Participation of each Public Meeting, as follows:

Item #5:

Communications and Reports from Town Manager – This segment of the meeting shall not exceed twenty (20) minutes unless extended by majority consent of the Council present.

Item #6:

<u>Public Input</u> – A segment of up to twenty (20) minutes (which may be extended by the Mayor with the consent of the Council) is set aside to hear from the public on any matter, **not on the agenda**. Speaker(s) generally are to limit their comments to three (3) minutes each and shall avoid personalities or impugning of improper motive to any person.

Item #8:

<u>Public Petitions</u> – A South Windsor Resident or Taxpayer may petition the Council to submit a new item on the agenda as described in Section 312 of the Town Charter.

Item #12:

<u>Public Participation</u> – A segment of up to twenty (20) minutes (which may be extended by the Mayor with the consent of the Council) is set aside to hear from the public on any matter **on the agenda**. Speaker(s) generally are to limit their comments to three (3) minutes each, and shall avoid personalities or impugning of improper motive to any person.

Item #17:

<u>Public Input/Participation</u> – A segment of up to ten (10) minutes (which may be extended by the Mayor with the consent of the Council) is set aside to hear from the public **on any matter**. Speaker(s) generally are to limit their comments to three (3) minutes each and shall avoid personalities or impugning or improper motive to any person.

i. For the purpose of this section, the day of the Town Council meeting shall be considered a business day prior to the meeting.
